Members are asked to commit to the principles of Bristol's Good Food Charter producing food that is good for people, places and the planet and could include any of the following:

- Being transparent about methods and welcoming customer involvement
- Being, or working towards being, pesticide and petro-chemical free
- Being GM free
- A commitment to organic principles, joining the Wholesome Food Association or holding organic certification (e.g. Soil Association, Organic Farmers and Growers)
- Avoiding artificial additives in processing
- Sourcing as locally as possible
- Committed to or working towards paying the Living Wage

Membership costs just £15 a year for primary producers within 10 miles of Bristol, trainees and third sector supporters or £25 a year for producers within 10 to 50 miles of Bristol, wholesalers, distributors and supporting businesses.
